World Day of Migrants and Refugees 2024 is observed on Sunday, Sept. 29. Marked annually by the Catholic Church since 1914, this day serves as a reminder to pray, reflect, and take action for those forced to leave their homes in search of safety, dignity, and a better future. This year's theme "God Walks With His People" is explored in a message from Pope Francis, found on the Vatican website.
